• Within 6 weeks after receival: lodge appeal at the CBE

- The appeal has to contain the following (article 4.1 lid 3 Regulations of Procedure of the CBE):
- Name, studentnumber, adress, e-mail en telephonenumber of the person concerned;
- Date the appeal was written;
- Derscription of the decision against which the appeal is directed;
 - Copy of the contested decisison;
 - Grounds of appeal;

• CBE sends the appeal to the defendant. (Examination Board);

- CBE requests the defendant (Examination Board) to have a consultation with the appellant/student within 3 weeks after sending the appeal to try to come to an amicable settlement; (article 4.7 Regulations of Procedure of the CBE).
- If parties reach a settlement, the appeal will be withdrawn by the appellant. (student);
- •If parties do not reach a settlement, the CBE will handle the appeal;
 - The appeal can although be withdrawn by the appellant anytime (student);

Not reached a settlement?

<u>procedure</u>

Why?

- •The defendant (Examination Board) submits a letter of defense within 3 weeks after receiving the appeal; (artikel 4.14 Regulations of Procedure of the CBE).
- CBE sends letter of defense to the appellant (student);

CBE sets a date of hearing

- Parties are being summoned in writing to come to the hearing; (article 4.15 Regulations of Procedure of the CBE)
- The aim is to plan a hearing within 6 weeks after receiving the appeal;

Handling of the appeal at hearing

• The appeal will be heard in public hearing where parties in each other's presence will be heard; (article 4.16 Regulations of Procedure of the CBE).

CBE reaches verdict

- The goal is that the CBE will make a decision within 3 weeks after the hearing;.
- The period for making a decision is **10 weeks** calculated from the day after the term of lodging an appeal has expired; (article 4.9 Regulations of Procedure of the CBE).
